

that we may protect the world and not prey on it, that we may sow beauty, not pollution and destruction.






A prayer for our Earth (Pope Francis)




September 14 Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross



21 September: UN International Day of Peace

- 2022 Theme: End racism. Build peace.
- Each year the International Day of Peace is observed around the world on 21 September. The UN General Assembly has declared this as a day devoted to strengthening the ideals of peace, through observing 24 hours of nonviolence and cease-fire.
- But achieving true peace entails much more than laying down arms. It requires the building of societies where all members feel that they can flourish. It involves creating a world in which people are treated equally, regardless of their race.

22 September: World Car Free Day



Care of the earth and its precious resources

- This is a global event held on September 22.
- It encourages drivers to give up their cars for a day and use public transportation, ride a bicycle, or simply walk.
- The first Car Free Days were organized in Bath (UK), Reykjavík (Iceland), and La Rochelle (France) in 1995.
- That same year, the World Car Free Day consortium was established to support such campaigns worldwide.
- The first nationwide campaign was organized in the United Kingdom in 1997.
- In 2000, the European Commission supported the initiative and held a Europe-wide Car Free Day on September 22.


25 September: Rosh Hashanah (Jewish)

- The Jewish New Year is called Rosh Hashanah and usually falls during September or early October.
- This is a two-day holiday which celebrates the start of the new year according to the Jewish calendar.
- In 2022, Rosh Hashanah will begin at sundown on September 25th and end at sundown on September 27th.


29 September: Feast of St. Michael the Archangel

- The Feast of St Michael is on 29 Sept. On this Feast, in some schools (Mary Ward schools, Loreto), a picture or a statue of St. Michael is carried to a sacred space by the youngest pupil in the school. Today, we pray for protection for all.
- This practice stems from a story of an attack in 1695 on the Bar Convent in York founded by Mary Ward. The sisters prayed to the archangel St Michael to protect them. When a vision of St Michael on a white horse appeared over the house, the mob fled in terror. An engraving of St Michael now hangs over the front door of the Bar Convent to commemorate this story.
