So they brought the donkey to Jesus, who rode alongside the crowds while the people were spreading their cloaks on the road;


As he was approaching the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude began to praise God aloud with joy



They divide my clothes among them and cast lots for my robe.








 Though suffering and chaos befall us, they can never quench that inner light of providence.

And no hurt or harm be done Anywhere along the holy mountain.




We pray for all who are suffering the injustice and heart-breaking devastation of war. We remember especially the people of Ukraine.


