A REFLECTION AT THE END OF THE YEAR

Step One: Become aware of God's presence.

Ask the Holy Spirit to help you review the year with faith, hope and love... in a wholesome way... not judging ... all is well and will be well • • • • • • • • • • • •

Step Two: Review the year with gratitude.

Pay attention to the gifts we received this year. Name those that come to mind and thank God for them.

Step Three: Pay attention to your emotions.

Think over the year again and notice your emotional reactions. What memories speak most loudly to you? What events, conversations,

relationships, or activities bring up the most emotion now, as you remember them?

Ask God to help you stay with these emotions. What can you learn about yourself or about your situation from these feelings?

Step Four: Choose one feature of the year and pray about it.

While you are reflecting on your memories and emotions, let one feature come to mind. It may be a single event, or maybe it's a pattern of your own behavior that has come to mind as you reviewed the year.

Stay with the one thing that has come to you with the most power and pray from those thoughts and emotions.

Entrust everything to God

When you look for me, you will find me. Yes, when you seek me with all your heart. (Jeremiah 29:13)

Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you. (Matthew 7)

At The End Of The Year John O'Donohue


