PALM SUNDAY

Mark 11:1-10

As they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples,

saying to them,

"Go to the village ahead of you, and just as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden.

Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, 'Why are you doing this?' say, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here shortly.'"

They went and found a colt outside in the street, tied at a doorway.

As they untied it,
some people standing there asked,
"What are you doing, untying that colt?"
They answered as Jesus had told them to, and
the people let them go.

When they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks over it, he sat on it.

Many people spread their cloaks on the road, while others spread branches they had cut in the fields. Those who went ahead and those who followed shouted,

"Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David!

Hosanna in the highest heaven!





What Kind of King are You?

Spy Wednesday / Holy Wednesday

Easter Triduum

The high point of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum

—from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday.

The liturgical services that take place during the Triduum are:

Mass of the Lord's Supper

Good Friday of the Lord's Passion

Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord



Holy Thursday

Holy Thursday is the commemoration of the Last Supper of Jesus

Jesus celebrated the supper as a Passover feast.

The Last Supper was the final meal Jesus shared with his Disciples in Jerusalem.

During the meal, Jesus predicts his betrayal.

That I met God along the way in the healing and forgiveness I received....




Good Friday



At the Easter Vigil, the Paschal candle is lit from this new fire.

The Paschal Candle



The Paschal Candle is the great Christian symbol of Easter. It is lit from the Easter fire at the start of the Easter vigil.

Representing the risen Christ — the light of the world — the Paschal Candle is carried into the darkened church. Everyone in the congregation lights their small candle from this Easter candle.

The candle is placed on a high stand by the altar and remains lighting for every Liturgy over the fifty days of Easter.

Paschal Candle at the Baptismal Font



After the season of Easter, the paschal candle is placed beside the baptismal font and is lit for every celebration of Baptism. A new paschal candle is lit each Easter.

• The Exsultet is the Easter Proclamation, sung at the end of the Service of Light, the first part of the Easter Vigil. It tells the story of the whole Easter mystery of the death and resurrection of Jesus.




