




St. Brigid's Day, celebrated on 1 February will be marked by our national holiday on Monday, 3 February.



The Story of Brigid

- Brigid was born at a time of major transition in 5th century Ireland. She embodies in herself the pre-Christian Celtic and Christian Celtic spirit. It is generally accepted that St Brigid built her double monastery for men and women in Kildare around 470 AD.
- Some scholars credit Brigid with pioneering monastic life in Ireland. Her monastery was acclaimed as a centre of education, pilgrimage, worship and hospitality until the 16th century when all the monasteries were suppressed.



The idea for this exhibition came from my research into the two Brigid's of Ireland; goddess and saint. When An Post commissioned me to make art for stamps representing them both I was inspired by their living connections to rural life and the landscape. Ireland is a sacred place. Each print in this show represents an appearance of the divine, whether through the stories of these powerful female forces or the land that gave them to the world. A few years ago, pupils from Loreto College St Stephen's Green designed stamps to commemorate St Brigid as part of their *FÉILE RANGEELA* project with ATU, Galway and the Loyola Academy, Chennai, India.

Bless every hand that toils to bring it joy


Bless every foot that walks its portals through

May Brigid bless the house that shelters you.




Hymn to St Brigid: Dearc Anuas

2nd February The Presentation of the Lord

- Today the Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord which occurs forty days after the birth of Jesus and is also known as Candlemas Day, since the blessing and procession of candles àre included in today's liturgy.

3rd February Feast of Saint Blaise

- Today is the Feast of St. Blaise who is the patron saint for sore throats and sick cattle.
- St. Blaise was a bishop and martyr who lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. For a time, Blaise lived in a cave to escape persecution. On his feast the church recalls a miracle cure associated with him and celebrates the blessing of the throats. Blaise is reputed to have saved the life of a boy who was choking on a fish bone. The saint said that anyone who lit a candle in his memory would be free of infection, thus candles are used in the traditional throat blessing. He is listed among the Fourteen Holy Helpers, saints revered as healers. He is the patron saint of throat illnesses, animals, wool combers, and wool trading.


St Josephine Bakhita International Day of Prayer & Awareness Against Human Trafficking




